ORDINANCE 14-42

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WESTFIELD AMENDING THE TRAFFIC REGULATIONS OF THE CITY OF WESTFIELD

WHEREAS, The City of Westfield, (“City”) is a duly formed municipal corporation within the State of Indiana, governed by its duly elected Mayor and Common Council (“Council”); and,

WHEREAS, the Council has the duty and authority to maintain regulations that ensure the safest possible operation of motor vehicles within the City; and,

WHEREAS, it has been deemed necessary to adopt the following amendments to the Westfield Code of Ordinances.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Westfield City Common Council meeting in session as follows that:

- Section 1.** Chapter 58, Division 10. Figures, Sec. 58-346 through Sec. 58-363.1 of the Westfield Code is hereby amended by the deletion of the existing conflicting language and by the addition of the language which is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated herein.
- Section 2.** In addition to any other general penalty provisions contained in the Westfield Code of Ordinances, all other penalties under Title 9 of the Indiana Code for Class C Infractions may be assessed.
- Section 3.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect in accordance with Indiana law, upon the passage of any applicable waiting periods, all as provided by the laws of the State of Indiana. All ordinances or parts thereof that are in conflict herewith are hereby ordered repealed. Any portion of this Ordinance later deemed void shall not operate to negate the remaining portion herein.

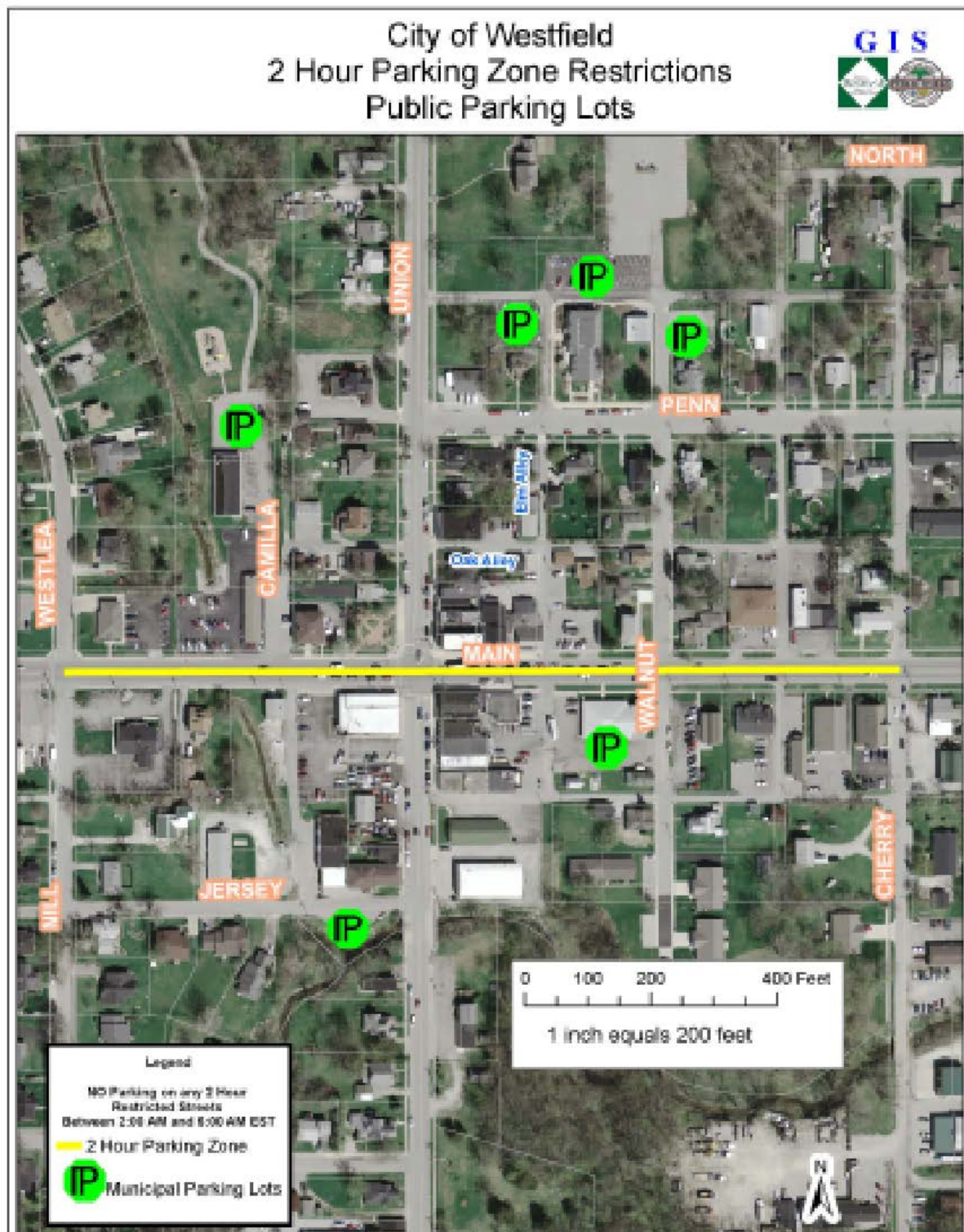


Figure 9E - 1

Penalties for 2 Hour Parking Restriction Zones

A. Each violator of the restrictions and provisions of this traffic offense shall pay a fine and penalty to the City of Westfield, in the sum of ten dollars (\$10), if paid within seven (7) days of the date of the time of issuance of the traffic offense. Additional late fees shall be assessed based upon the following fine schedule:

1. Unpaid between eight and fourteen (8-14) days of the date of issuance: Twenty dollars (\$20)
2. Unpaid between fifteen and twenty-one (15-21) days of the date of issuance: Forty dollars (\$40)
3. Unpaid between twenty-two and twenty-eight (22-28) days of the date of issuance: Sixty dollars (\$60)
4. Unpaid between twenty-nine and thirty-five (29-35) days of the date of issuance: Eighty dollars (\$80)
5. Unpaid after thirty-six (36) days of the date of issuance: One Hundred dollars (\$100)

B. Any Vehicle having three (3) UNPAID parking violations in excess of sixty (60) days after the date of issuance that is found in a Parking Zone Restriction Area is subject to being restrained by having a wheel boot installed by employees of the City of Westfield, until such time as all outstanding fines and fees are paid in full. In addition, there will be a twenty-five dollar (\$25) fee for the removal of wheel boot. It is the discretion of the Chief of Police to have motorcycles and/or any other vehicles towed to safe storage in lieu of using the wheel boot. Said vehicle will be released only after payment of all fines and fees are paid and full, and any costs incurred by the city for the towing of the vehicle.

C. Any attempt to evade this ordinance by a motorist by moving their vehicle from one parking restriction zone parking spot to another parking restriction zone parking spot will be deemed in violation of this ordinance.

D. In the event that such a fine has not been paid within ninety (90) days of the date of the issuance the violator may be docketed in the Hamilton County Courts and prosecuted as a Class C infraction. In such event, the violator shall be obligated to pay any costs imposed by reason of the docking with the Hamilton County Courts in addition to the fines prescribed herein.

PETITION HISTORY

This petition was introduced at the August 11, 2014 Council meeting and appeared before the Technical Advisory Committee on August 22, 2014. It received a public hearing for the PUD at the September 2, 2014 Advisory Plan Commission (the "APC") meeting. The APC forwarded the petition to the Westfield City Council (the "Council") with a favorable recommendation (7-0) for approval at its September 22, 2014, meeting. The APC Certification is included as Exhibit 6.

PROCEDURAL

Requests for a change in zoning are required to be considered at a public hearing, in accordance with Indiana Code 36-7-4-1511. The public hearing for this petition was held on September 2, 2014, at

the APC meeting. Notice of the September 2, 2014, public hearing was provided in accordance with the APC Rules of Procedure.

At its September 15, 2014 meeting, the APC issued a favorable recommendation (7-0) of the proposed change of zoning to the Council.

The Council may take action on this item at its September 22, 2014 meeting.

PROJECT OVERVIEW

The subject property is within the Grand Park Sports Campus and is generally located on the southwest corner of 191st Street and Grand Park Boulevard. The property is approximately 14.5 acres in size and is currently vacant. The land to the north is zoned Agriculture-Single Family 1 (AG-SF1) and is used for residential and agriculture purposes.

Development and Architectural Standards: The PUD defaults to the General Business (GB) development standards, while modifying some standards to ensure the project is developed in a manner that accommodates scale of the building and is consistent with Grand Park. Specific landscaping plans and architectural renderings are included that require substantial compliance made with regard to landscaping and architecture, respectively. Signs shall be consistent with existing Grand Park signage with modifications allowed as approved by the Economic and Community Development Director.

Comprehensive Plan: The Westfield-Washington Township Comprehensive Plan, Family Sports Capital Addendum II (the “Addendum”) identifies the subject property as part of the Family Sports Capital of America area. The Addendum was adopted in December of 2010 to serve as the vision and guide specifically for the Family Sports Capital area, later renamed Grand Park.

The Addendum specifically states that the Sports Campus be designed to accommodate (1) field sports, (2) diamond sports; and (3) an indoor sports facility. Said facilities are to support the hosting of championship amateur sports tournaments during the winter months making the Grand Park Sports Campus a year-round facility.

Additionally, the Addendum identifies goals established by the Sports Commission and delivered to the Mayor in a report titled “Westfield Family Sports Complex, Phase I Report”. One of these goals was to pursue economic development opportunities to capitalize on Westfield’s intergenerational sports niche. In the examples listed, multiple championship quality sports facilities and other uses which would support and compliment the Westfield intergeneration sports initiative were included.

The Addendum also included a summary of the Sports Commission’s Phase II Report (the “Report”), also delivered to the Mayor. In that summary, the Report further defined the scope of

initial sports to be offered which included indoor training facility sports: all field and diamond sports with an emphasis on soccer, baseball and soccer leagues, travel and personal training use.

The conceptual plans renderings of the Grand Park Indoor Sports and Recreation Facility PUD Ordinance appear to be consistent with the vision of the Westfield-Washington Township Comprehensive Plan, Family Sports Capital Addendum II.

STATUTORY CONSIDERATIONS

Indiana Code 36-7-4-603 states that reasonable regard shall be paid to:

1. The Comprehensive Plan.
 2. Current conditions and the character of current structures and uses.
 3. The most desirable use for which the land is adapted.
 4. The conservation of property values throughout the jurisdiction.
 5. Responsible growth and development.
-

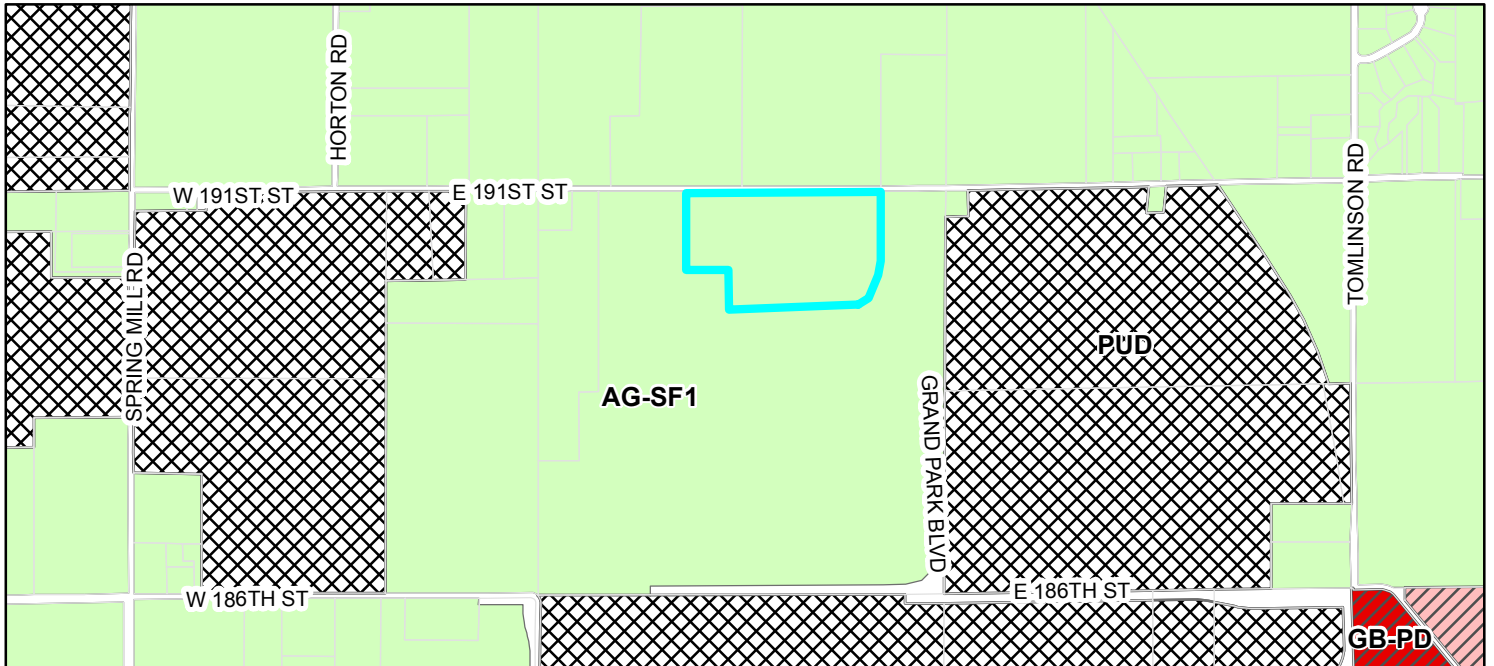

Aerial Location Map

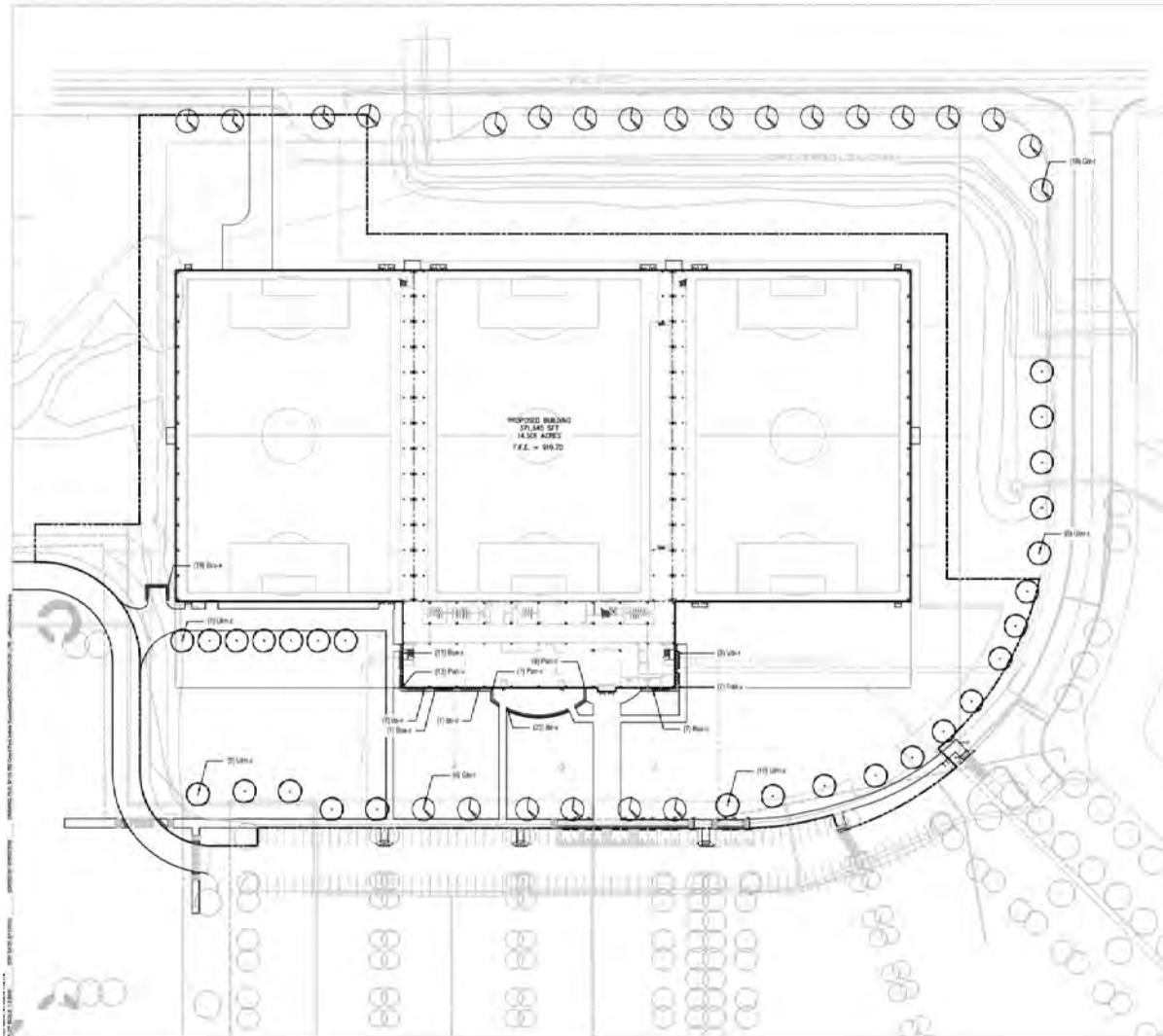


Zoning Map

GENERAL LANDSCAPE AND PLANTING NOTES

1. Plant material to be installed and maintained by a qualified and experienced landscape installer.
2. All materials are subject to the approval of the Landscape Architect and Owner at any time. Landscape Architect to inspect all plant locations and plant installation prior to installation. Submit all plant locations for review and approval by the Landscape Architect before planting. On-site adjustments may be required. Plants are to be freshly dug. Transporting of plants shall be done in a manner as to not damage the plant or compromise the health, or alter the characteristics of plant materials.
3. Rootballs and rootballs or rootballs shall be installed in accordance with American Standards for Nursery Stock - MAIN LEADERS OF ALL TREES SHALL REMAIN INTACT. Remove from the site any plant material that comes down or debilitates within five (5) days after planting. Replace immediately with approved specified material.
4. Plant counts indicated on drawings are for Landscape Architect's use only. Contractor shall make own plant quantity, identify, using drawings, specifications, and plant schedule requirements (i.e., spacing) unless otherwise directed by Landscape Architect. Contractor to verify and measurements and install appropriate quantities as governed by plant spacing per schedule.
5. All plant beds shall receive 2" minimum of genuine unadorned hardwood bark mulch unless otherwise noted. Apply pre-emergent herbicide as directed by the manufacturer prior to installing mulch. Stake all areas covered by construction activities that are not otherwise noted to ensure permanent, planting bed or other treatment.
6. The Contractor shall install and/or amend topsoil in all proposed bed areas to meet ASTM D2000 standards. Landscape shall verify depth and quality of topsoil prior to plant installation. A minimum of 4" of topsoil is required for lawn areas, 12" for plant beds. Topsoil sources shall include the value of surface not stockpiled in site, clean of roots, stumps, soil, stones, clay lumps, and other extraneous or foreign materials larger than 1". Supplement with imported topsoil from off-site sources when quantities are insufficient. Do not utilize supplemental topsoil from agricultural land, bays, or marshes. Irrigation amendments, organic amendments, and fertilizers shall be used to amend topsoil as needed for long-term plant health.
7. Verify all utility locations in the field prior to beginning work. Repair all damaged utilities to satisfaction of the Owner and Contracting Authority at no additional cost.
8. Install all plant material in accordance with all local codes and ordinances. Coordinate with the Owner to obtain any required permits necessary to complete work. All ownership and materials shall be guaranteed by the Contractor for a period of one (1) calendar year after Final Acceptance.
9. Maintain all plant material for a three (3) month period from date of Substantial Completion. Maintenance shall include pruning, watering, weeding, fertilizing, weeding, replacing plant material, spraying for diseases and insects, and replacing tree wrapings. Recommended long-term maintenance procedures shall be provided to the Owner before expiration of this period.
10. Satisfactory Second Lawn. At end of maintenance period, a healthy, uniform, close stand of grass has been established free of weeds and surface irregularities, with coverage exceeding 90 percent over any 10 sq. ft. (3' x 3') sq. ft. and some spots not exceeding 3 by 3 inches. Maintenance lawn that do not comply with requirements and continue maintenance until lawn is fully satisfactory to the Owner.

NOTE: All HVAC and dumpster enclosures will be screened per the requirements of the Zoning Ordinance.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 14-125

RESOLUTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WESTFIELD, INDIANA CONFIRMING SEPTEMBER 8, 2014 RESOLUTION NUMBER 14-124 DETERMINING THAT THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR AN ECONOMIC REVITALIZATION AREA HAVE BEEN MET

WHEREAS, pursuant to Indiana Code 6-1.1-12.1-1, *et. seq.* (the “Act”), the City of Westfield, Indiana (the “City”) by and through its Common Council acting in its capacity as the fiscal body of the City and acting as the designating body identified in the Act (the “Council”) has the right and opportunity to abate the payment of real property taxes for real estate located within an area declared by the Council to be an Economic Revitalization Area and to also abate the payment of personal property taxes within the Economic Revitalization Area;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Council may find that a particular area within the jurisdiction of the City is an Economic Revitalization Area and may by adoption of a resolution declare such area to be an Economic Revitalization Area which resolution must be confirmed, modified, or rescinded;

WHEREAS, the Council adopted its Resolution Number 14-124 (the “Declaratory Resolution”) on September 8, 2014 pursuant to the Act declaring the area whose boundaries are located within the corporate boundaries of the City commonly known as 19845 US 31, Westfield, Indiana more particularly described in Exhibit A (the “Area”) attached hereto and made a part hereof which is also shown on the map attached hereto as Exhibit B and made a part hereof as an Economic Revitalization Area in which property owners making application to the City pursuant to the Act subsequently approved by this Council pursuant to the Act may receive real property tax abatement and/or personal property tax abatement pursuant to the applicable procedures of the Act;

WHEREAS, the Council has caused to be published a notice (the “Notice”) pursuant to the Act and Indiana Code 5-3-1 of the adoption and substance of the Declaratory Resolution, including notice that the Council would hold a public hearing in accordance with the Act on September 22, 2014 which Notice was published at least ten (10) days prior to the date of the public hearing;

WHEREAS, the Council in accordance with Section 2 of the Act has caused to be filed a copy of the Notice and the Declaratory Resolution with the Hamilton County Assessor and the officers of each taxing unit which is authorized to fix budgets, tax rates, and tax levies under Indiana Code 6-1.1-17-5 in the Area at least ten (10) days prior to the date of the September 22, 2014 public hearing;

WHEREAS, at the Public Hearing held on the date herof, the Council received, heard and considered any remonstrance's and objections from interested persons and heard evidence concerning the qualification of the Area as an Economic Revitalization Area;

WHEREAS, after considering the evidence, this Council desires to take final action determining whether the qualifications for an economic revitalization area have been met and further, to take final action confirming the Declaratory Resolution.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF WESTFIELD, INDIANA AS FOLLOWS:**

SECTION I. The Area is located within the corporate boundaries of the City.

SECTION II. The area is undesirable for, or impossible of, normal development and occupancy because of a lack of development, cessation of growth, deterioration of improvements or character of occupancy, age, obsolescence, substandard buildings, or other factors which have impaired values or prevent a normal development of property or use of property or is an area where a facility or a group of facilities that are technologically, economically, or energy obsolete are located and where the obsolescence may lead to decline in employment and tax revenues. The abatement schedule set out in resolution 14-126 is based upon factors 1-4 as pursuant to Indiana Code 6-1.1-12.1-17(a).

SECTION III. Resolution 14-124 adopted by the Council on September 8, 2014 is hereby confirmed.

SECTION IV. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption. The period for personal property tax deductions under the Act for the Project shall be five (5) years, and for each of the five (5) years, one hundred percent (100%) of the personal property taxes assessed on the Property shall be abated. The total investment in Personal Property for new IT equipment is One Million One-Hundred and Twenty Eight Thousand Dollars (\$1,128,000). It is estimated that Three-Hundred and Sixty (360) new individuals will be employed through 2019 at average wage of twenty six dollars (\$26.00) per hour without benefits. No new infrastructure is expected to be installed by the Taxpayers investment.

WHEREAS, the Westfield-Washington Advisory Plan Commission (the "Commission") considered a petition (Docket 1409-PUD-15), filed with the Commission requesting an amendment to Ordinance 06-49, enacted by the Town Council on October 9, 2006 , and amended by (i) Ordinance 08-05, enacted by the City Council on February 11, 2008 (ii) Ordinance 09-17, enacted by the City Council on September 14, 2009; (iii) Ordinance 10-01, enacted by the City Council on February 8, 2010; (iv) Ordinance 10-05, enacted by the City Council on April 12, 2010; (v) Ordinance 10-08, enacted by the City Council on May 24, 2010; (vi) Ordinance 10-19, enacted by the City Council on September 13, 2010; (vii) Ordinance 11-01, enacted by the City Council on January 10, 2011; (viii) Ordinance 12-10, enacted by the City Council on April 9, 2012; (ix) Ordinance 13-03, enacted by the City Council on February 11, 2013; (x) Ordinance 13-06, enacted by the City Council on March 11, 2013; (xi) Ordinance 13-08, enacted by the City Council on March 25, 2013; (xii) Ordinance 14-02, enacted by the City Council on February 24, 2014 Ordinance 14-02; and (xiii) Ordinance 14-16, enacted by the City Council on May 12, 2014 (collectively, the "Bridgewater PUD Ordinance");

SECTION 1. The Bridgewater PUD Ordinance is hereby amended, but only with respect to (i) the standards applicable to signage established in what is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit "A" and (ii) only applicable to the real estate described in what is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as

Exhibit “B” (the “Real Estate”). In all other respects, the Bridgewater PUD Ordinance shall remain in effect and unchanged.

SECTION 2. Upon motion duly made and seconded, this Ordinance 14-44 was fully passed by members of the Council this 22 day of September, 2014. Further, this Ordinance 14-44 shall be in full force and effect in accordance with Indiana law, upon the passage of any applicable waiting periods, all as provided by the laws of the State of Indiana. All ordinances or parts thereof that are in conflict with this Ordinance 14-44 are hereby amended. To the extent that this Ordinance 14-44 conflicts with the terms of any previously-adopted ordinance or part thereof, the terms of this Ordinance 14-44 shall prevail.

Section 1: Multi-Tenant Panel Monument Signs – The Bridgewater Center at 146th Street shall be permitted the following Multi-Tenant Panel Monument Signs in addition to the signs permitted under the Bridgewater PUD unless otherwise restricted in this Exhibit A:

- A. The term “Multi-Tenant Panel Monument Sign” is hereby defined as a monument sign containing (i) tenant signage including names, logos, trademarks, and so on associated with a permitted business on the Real Estate, (ii) the name of the center, and (iii) the “of Westfield” as depicted on Page 2 of this Exhibit A.
- B. Number and Location:
 - 1. One (1) at 146th Street, west of and adjacent to the road cut into the Real Estate,
 - 2. One (1) at Carey Road, north of and adjacent to the road cut into the Real Estate, and
 - 3. The minimum setback shall be five (5) feet from the public street rights-of-way.
- C. Size:
 - 1. Ninety (90) square feet per face shall be the maximum sign area per sign; and,
 - 2. Fifteen (15) feet in height shall be the maximum sign height as measured to the top of the sign as shown on the illustration on Page 2 of Exhibit A.
- D. Design:
 - 1. The design of the signs shall be as generally as depicted on Page 2 of this Exhibit A,
 - 2. The materials and detail of the sign structure shall be as generally depicted on Page 3 of the Exhibit A including a brick base and columns and cast stone accents,
 - 3. Sign caps and bases shall not be used for display or advertising purposes,
 - 4. Signs shall have a minimum base height of six (6) inches and a minimum cap height of two (2) inches. Total aggregate sign cap and base height shall not exceed six (6) feet,
 - 5. Electronic Signage as Defined in the Zoning Ordinance, as amended, shall be permitted in the area as conceptually depicted on Page 2 of this Exhibit A and shall include green colored illumination of the LED fuel pricing area.
 - 6. Individual sign panels (i) shall have a common opaque background color as conceptually depicted on Page 2 of this Exhibit A and (ii) shall be illuminated in such a manner that only the copy area (letters and logos) are illuminated when the sign is lit.
 - 7. Identification with the City of Westfield (“of Westfield”) shall be required.
 - 8. The replacement of individual panels on nonresidential center monument signs does not require a permit.
 - 9. Individual tenant panels may occupy up to seventy-five (75) square feet of the sign area.
 - 10. The signs shall not be illuminated between 12:00a.m. and 6:00a.m., unless one of the businesses advertised on the sign is open between those hours, at which time the sign may not be illuminated at the time all businesses establishments are closed.

Section 2: Identification signs – Identification signs permitted under Section 14 (D) (2) of the Bridgewater PUD Ordinance shall not be permitted at the two road cuts into the Real Estate.

Section 3: Free-standing signs – Free-standing signs permitted under Section 14 (C) (6) of the Bridgewater PUD Ordinance shall not be permitted on the Real Estate.

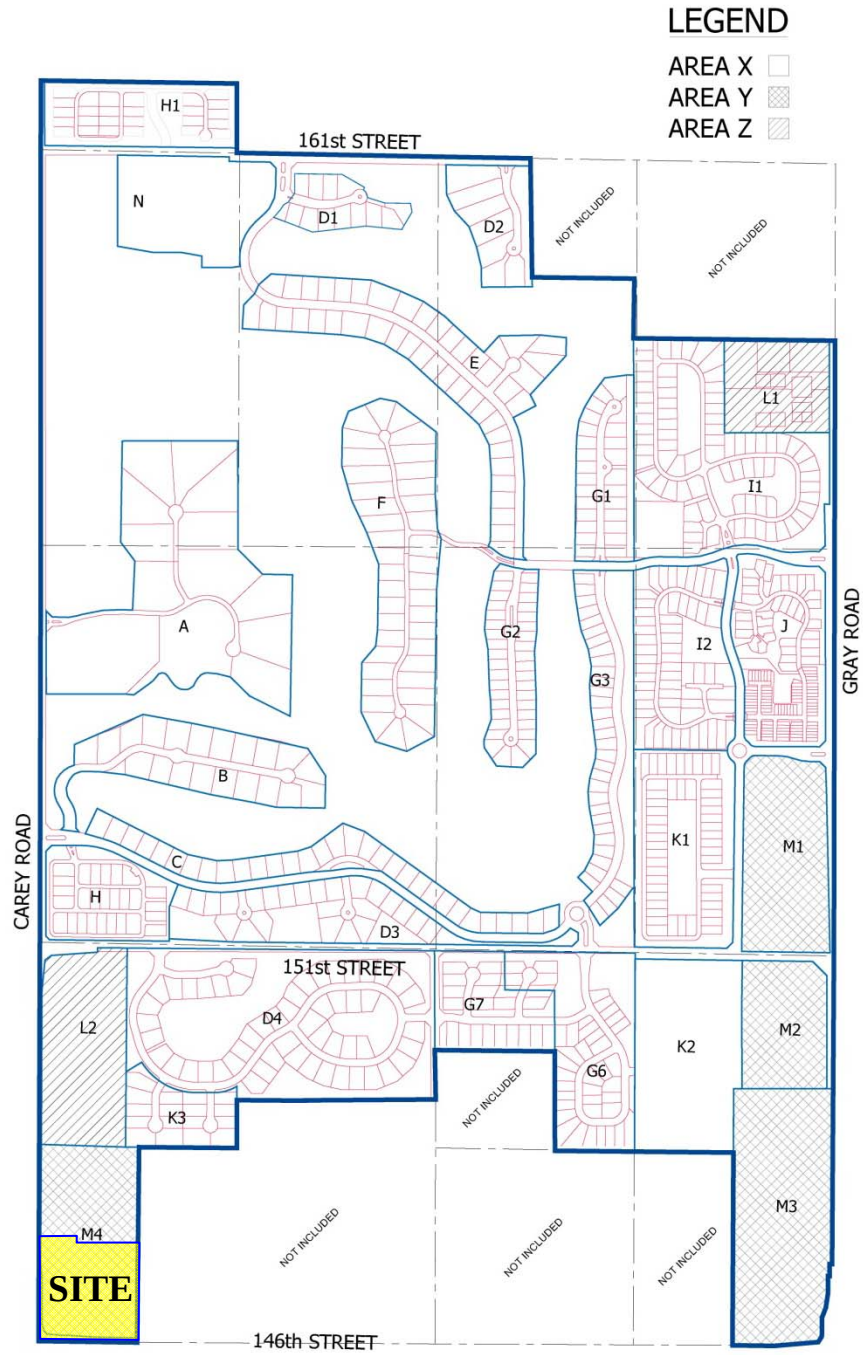

PETITION HISTORY

This petition was introduced at the September 8, 2014, City Council meeting. The petition received a public hearing at the September 15, 2014, Advisory Plan Commission (the "APC") meeting, and the APC forwarded the petition to the Westfield City Council (the "Council") with a favorable recommendation for approval at that same meeting. The APC Certification is included as Exhibit 5.

PROCEDURAL

- Amendments to Planned Unit Developments are required to be considered at a public hearing, in accordance with Indiana Code 36-7-4-1511. The public hearing for this petition was held on September 15, 2014, at the APC meeting. Notice of the September 15, 2014, public hearing was provided in accordance with the APC Rules of Procedure.
- At its September 15, 2014 meeting, the APC issued a favorable recommendation (7-0) of the proposed change in zoning request.
- The Council may take action on this item at its September 22, 2014, meeting.

PROJECT OVERVIEW

Project Location

The subject property is approximately 9.5 acres +/- in size and is located at the northeast corner of Carey Road and 146th Street.

Project Description

The proposal would allow two (2) multi-tenant monument signs (the “Monument Signs”) for the Bridgewater Center. One sign would be located at the Carey Road entrance and the other would be located at the 146th Street entrance. Currently, the Bridgewater PUD Ordinance allows individual businesses the ability to install a 6’ tall ground sign. The Bridgewater PUD Ordinance also allows 15’ tall center “identification signs” at the entrances to the commercial center – tenant information is not permitted on the “identification signs”. As proposed, the Monument Signs would be installed in lieu of individual business ground signs, and they would replace the permitted “identification signs” for the center.

Monument Sign Size

As proposed, each Monument Sign would be no taller than 15’ in height, and would have a sign display area of no more than 90 square feet (per side of a two-sided sign). For comparison, the “identification signs” (which cannot contain tenant information) that are currently allowed by the Bridgewater PUD Ordinance could be up to 15’ in height and 75 square feet per side. The proposed Monument Signs would be limited to 75 square feet of tenant information, and the remainder of the proposed 90 square feet of sign area could be used for center identification and “of Westfield” identification. By further comparison, the City’s current sign standards would allow a non-residential center of this size a 15’ tall sign that could be up to 120 square feet in sign area, per side. The City’s sign standards would limit the center to one (1) sign, however.

Monument Sign Details

As proposed, the Monument Signs would be required to have a brick base, brick columns, and a limestone (or similar) cap and accent features, as depicted in the proposed exhibits. The proposal also includes the use of electronic gas price signage, and it defaults to the City’s Electronic Signage section of the Sign Standards for these electronic message boards. The proposal indicates that the sign panels would be designed in a manner so that only the copy area (letters and logos) would be illuminated with the sign is lit.

APC CONDITIONS OF A FAVORABLE RECOMMENDATION

At the September 15, 2014 APC meeting, the petitioner committed to a few clarification modifications to the proposed ordinance during a presentation to the APC. As a part of the motion to forward a positive recommendation to the City Council, the APC memorialized those commitments by adding the following conditions to its recommendation:

1. That the PUD Ordinance amendment be clarified so that the materials of the sign base and columns be brick with cast-stone accents;
2. That the PUD Ordinance amendment be clarified so that the background of the tenant sign panels be “opaque”;
3. That the display color on the electronic message boards for gas prices be limited to green,
4. That the rendering of the sign be revised to depict the words “Member Price”, “Regular” and “Diesel” as being incorporated into the opaque panels, not the black electronic message boards.

All of the changes listed above have been made to Ordinance 14-44 for the Council’s consideration on September 22, 2014, as presented in Exhibit 4.

ADDITIONAL MODIFICATION TO THE PUD ORDINANCE

In addition to the four (4) modifications listed above, the petitioner added a provision that required any illumination of the signs to be turned off between the hours of 12:00 AM and 6:00 AM, unless a business is open within those hours. These hours are consistent with the hours of operation limitations on the automobile service station (Ricker’s) at this location. The current sign regulations that apply to the Bridgewater Center do not restrict hours of illumination for monument/ground signs. This provision further restricts what would otherwise be allowed at this center.

STATUTORY CONSIDERATIONS

Indiana Code 36-7-4-603 states that reasonable regard shall be paid to:

1. The Comprehensive Plan.
2. Current conditions and the character of current structures and uses.
3. The most desirable use for which the land is adapted.
4. The conservation of property values throughout the jurisdiction.
5. Responsible growth and development.

RECOMMENDATIONS / ACTIONS

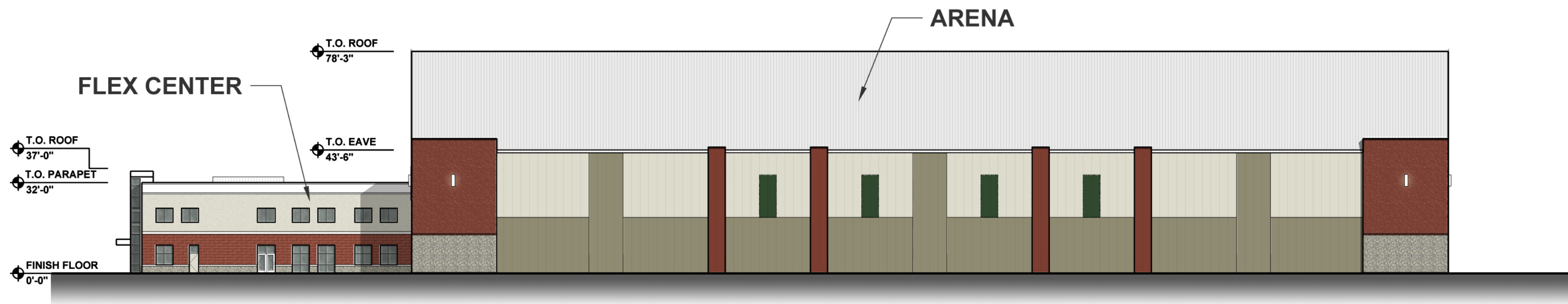




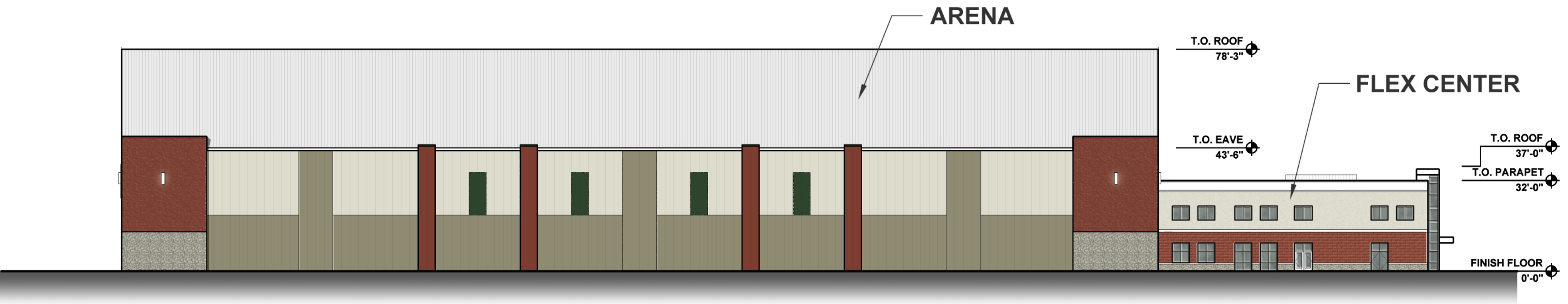
SOUTH ELEVATION

ORDINANCE NUMBER 14-35

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WESTFIELD AND WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP, HAMILTON COUNTY, INDIANA CONCERNING AMENDMENT TO TITLE 16 – LAND USE CONTROLS

This is a planned unit development ordinance (the “Grand Park Indoor Sports and Recreation Facility PUD Ordinance”) to amend the Westfield-Washington Zoning Ordinance of the City of Westfield and Washington Township, Hamilton County, Indiana (the “Zoning Ordinance”), enacted by the City of Westfield pursuant to its authority under the laws of the State of Indiana, Ind. Code § 36-7-4 *et seq.*, as amended.

WHEREAS, the City of Westfield, Indiana (“City”) and the Township of Washington, both of Hamilton County, Indiana are subject to the Westfield-Washington Township Zoning Ordinance;

WHEREAS, the Westfield-Washington Advisory Plan Commission (the “Commission”) held a public hearing on September 2, 2014 for a petition (Docket 1408-PUD-12), filed by Holladay Properties requesting to rezone lands within the City;

WHEREAS, the Commission took action to forward said petition (Docket 1408-PUD-12) to the Westfield City Council (the “Council”) with a favorable recommendation (by a vote of 7 in favor and 0 opposed) in accordance with Ind. Code § 36-7-4-608, as required by Ind. Code § 36-7-4-1505, on September 15, 2014;

WHEREAS, the Secretary of the Commission certified the action of the Commission to the City Council on September 16, 2014;

WHEREAS, the Westfield City Council is subject to the provisions of the Ind. Code § 36-7-4-1507 and Ind. Code § 36-7-4-1512 concerning any action on this request;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE WESTFIELD CITY COUNCIL THAT THE ZONING ORDINANCE AND ZONING MAP BE AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. APPLICABILITY OF ORDINANCE.

- 1.1 This PUD District Ordinance (the “Ordinance”) applies to the subject real estate more particularly described in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein (the “Real Estate”).
- 1.2 The underlying zoning district shall be the GB – General Business District (the “GB District”). Except as modified, revised, supplemented or expressly made

inapplicable by this Ordinance, the standards of the Zoning Ordinance applicable to the GB District shall apply.

- 1.3 All provisions and representations of the Zoning Ordinance that conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby replaced as applied to the Real Estate and shall be superseded by the terms of this Ordinance.

SECTION 2. PERMITTED USES.

- 2.1 Indoor Athletic Field Facility and uses contained therein, including but not limited to the following: Office, Restaurant, Retail Sales, Athletic and Recreational Uses, and other temporary and permanent associated uses as may be approved by the City of Westfield Economic and Community Development Department Director (the “ECD Director”).

SECTION 3. DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS.

- 3.1 Minimum Lot Frontage on Road – none.
- 3.2 Minimum Setback Lines
 - A. Minimum Front Yard building setback – ten (10) feet.
 - B. Minimum Side Yard building setback – ten (10) feet.
 - C. Minimum Rear Yard building setback – ten (10) feet.
- 3.3 Building Height shall not exceed eighty-five (85) feet.
- 3.4 No Off-Street Parking shall be required on the Real Estate. Off-street parking shall be shared on adjacent property within the Grand Park Sports Campus. A parking easement shall be provided for during platting.
- 3.5 Building Orientation: The building orientation standards of the Zoning Ordinance shall apply. Modifications to the building orientation standards may be made as approved by the ECD Director.
- 3.6 Building Materials: Building Materials shall be installed in substantial compliance with the building elevations attached hereto and incorporated herein by Exhibit B. Modifications to the building materials may be made as approved by the ECD Director.
- 3.7 Landscaping: The landscaping plan attached hereto and incorporated herein by Exhibit C shall be the landscaping plan for the Real Estate.
 - A. Landscaping shall be installed in substantial compliance with the plantings shown on Exhibit C.

- B. Dumpster enclosure shall be screened per the requirements of the Zoning Ordinance.
 - C. All HVAC equipment shall be screened per the requirements of the Zoning Ordinance.
 - D. Modifications to the required landscaping may be made as approved by the ECD Director.
- 3.8 Lighting: The standards of the Zoning Ordinance shall apply. All building decorative or accent lighting shall be permitted as approved by the ECD Director.
- 3.9 Signage: the standards of the Zoning Ordinance shall apply with the following exceptions:
- A. Signs shall be consistent with the Grand Park Sports Campus (including: color, style, lighting, size, etc.). Modifications to the signage may be made as approved by the ECD Director.
 - B. Wall signs shall be individual letters with reverse lighting.
 - C. Ground signs shall be consistent with the Grand Park Sports Campus (including: color, style, lighting, size, etc.). Modifications to the signage may be made as approved by the ECD Director.
 - D. Information Signs and Directory Signs shall be consistent with the Grand Park Sports Campus (including: color, style, lighting, size, etc.) and the Zoning Ordinance. Modifications to the signage may be made as approved by the ECD Director.
 - E. Temporary Signage shall only be permitted as approved by the ECD Director.

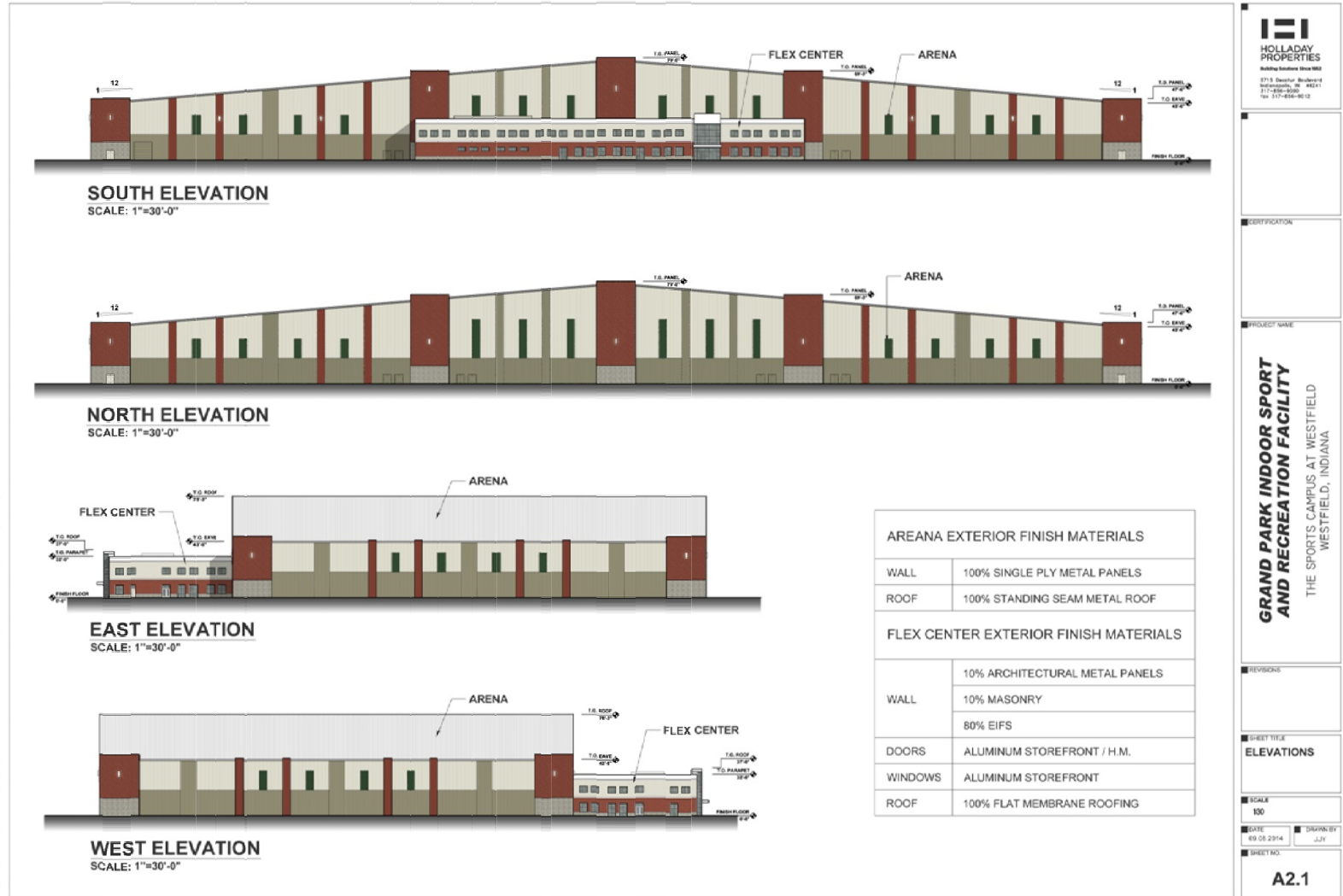
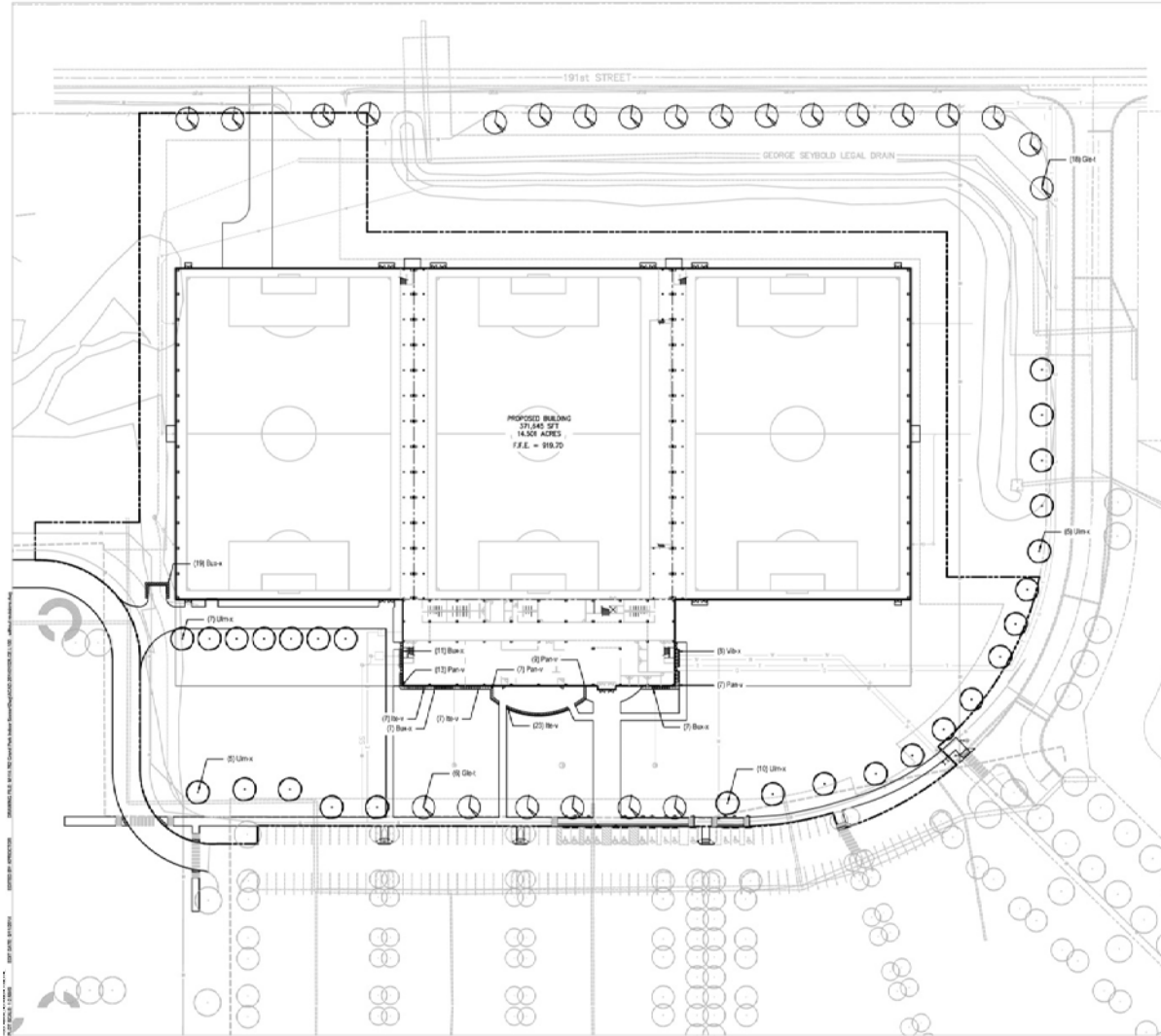


EXHIBIT B - BUILDING ELEVATIONS



GENERAL LANDSCAPE AND PLANTING NOTES

1. Plant material to be installed and maintained by a qualified and experienced landscape installer.
2. All materials are subject to the approval of the Landscape Architect and Owner at any time. Landscape Architect to inspect all plant locations and plant bed conditions prior to installation. Stave all plant locations for review and approval by the Landscape Architect before planting. On-site adjustments may be required. Plants are to be freshly dug. Transporting of plants shall be done in a manner as to not destroy the natural shape, compromise the health, or alter the characteristics of plant materials.
3. Rootballs shall meet or exceed size standards as set forth in American Standards for Nursery Stock. MAIN LEADERS OF ALL TREES SHALL REMAIN INTACT. Remove from the site any plant material that turns brown or debiles within five (5) days after planting. Replace immediately with approved specified material.
4. Plant counts indicated on drawings are for Landscape Architect's use only. Contractor shall make own plant quantity benefits using drawings, specifications, and plant schedule requirements (i.e., spacing), unless otherwise directed by Landscape Architect. Contractor to verify bed measurements and install appropriate quantities as governed by plant spacing per schedule.
5. All plant beds shall receive 2" minimum of genuine shredded hardwood bark mulch unless otherwise noted. Apply pre-emergent herbicide as directed by the manufacturer prior to installing mulch. Seed all areas disturbed by construction activities that are not otherwise noted to receive pavement, planting bed, or other treatment.
6. The Contractor shall install and/or amend topsoil in all proposed bed areas to meet ASTM D2009 standards. Landscape shall verify depth and quality of topsoil prior to plant installation. A minimum of 4" of topsoil is required for lawn areas, 12" for plant beds. Topsoil sources shall include the reuse of surface soil stockpiled on site, clean of roots, plants, soil, stones, clay lumps, and other extraneous or foreign materials larger than 1". Supplement with imported topsoil from off-site sources when quantities are insufficient. Do not obtain supplemental topsoil from agricultural land, bogs, or marshes. Inorganic amendments, organic amendments, and fertilizers shall be used to amend topsoil as needed for long-term plant health.
7. Verify all utility locations in the field prior to beginning work. Repair all damaged utilities to satisfaction of the Owner and Operating Authority at no additional cost.
8. Install all plant material in accordance with all local codes and ordinances. Coordinate with the Owner to obtain any required permits necessary to complete work. All workmanship and materials shall be guaranteed to the Contractor for a period of one (1) calendar year after Final Acceptance.
9. Maintain all plant material for a three (3) month period from date of Substantial Completion. Maintenance shall include pruning, cultivating, watering, weeding, fertilizing, restoring plant location, spraying for disease and insects, and replacing tree wrappings. Recommended long-term maintenance procedures shall be provided to the Owner before expiration of this period.
10. Satisfactory Seeded Lawn. At end of maintenance period, a healthy, uniform, close stand of grass has been established free of weeds and surface irregularities, with coverage exceeding 90 percent over any 10 sq. ft. (30 sq. ft.) and bare spots not exceeding 3 by 3 inches. Reestablish lawn that do not comply with requirements and continue maintenance until lawn is fully satisfactory to the Owner.

NOTE: All HVAC and dumpster enclosures will be screened per the requirements of the Zoning Ordinance.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 14-126

RESOLUTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WESTFIELD, INDIANA REGARDING CERTAIN TAX ABATEMENT DEDUCTIONS FOR CARRINGTON MORTGAGE SERVICES, LLC.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Indiana Code 6-1.1-12.1-1, *et. seq.* (the “Act”), the City of Westfield, Indiana (the “City”) by and through its Common Council acting in its capacity as the fiscal body of the City and acting as the designating body identified in the Act (the “Council”) has the right and opportunity to abate the payment of real property taxes for real estate located within an area declared by the Council to be an Economic Revitalization Area and to also abate the payment of personal property taxes within the Economic Revitalization Area;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Council may find that a particular area within the jurisdiction of the City is an Economic Revitalization Area and may by adoption of a resolution declare such area to be an Economic Revitalization Area which resolution must be confirmed, modified, or rescinded;

WHEREAS, the Council adopted its Resolution Number 14-124 (the “Declaratory Resolution”) on September 8, 2014 pursuant to the Act declaring the area whose boundaries are located within the corporate boundaries of the City commonly known as 19845 US 31, Westfield, Indiana more particularly described in Exhibit A (the “Area”) attached hereto and made a part hereof which is also shown on the map attached hereto as Exhibit B and made a part hereof as an Economic Revitalization Area in which property owners making application to the City pursuant to the Act subsequently approved by this Council pursuant to the Act may receive real property tax abatement and/or personal property tax abatement pursuant to the applicable procedures of the Act;

WHEREAS, the Council, after following all applicable procedures of the Act, took final action adopting Resolution Number 14-125 (the “Confirmatory Resolution”) on September 22, 2014 confirming the Declaratory Resolution, thereby establishing an Economic Revitalization Area.

WHEREAS, Carrington Mortgage, LLC. (the “Applicant”) has filed with this Council a Statement of Benefits, Personal Property (Form SB-1/PP) (“Form SB-1”) which describes the proposed project (the “Project”) to be installed by the Applicant, in order to receive personal property tax abatement for the Project;

WHEREAS, the Project includes the installation of new IT equipment in the Area which will be utilized by the Applicant in its office building located in the Area;

WHEREAS, this Council has reviewed the Form SB-1;

WHEREAS, the improvement of the Area will be of public utility and will be to the benefit and welfare of the citizens and taxpayers of the City.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF WESTFIELD, INDIANA AS FOLLOWS:**

SECTION I.

The proposed Project will be located in the Area which has been confirmed as an economic revitalization area pursuant to the Act.

SECTION II.

Based upon the information in the Form SB-1, this Council makes the following findings:

- (1) The estimate of One Million One-Hundred and Twenty Eight Thousand Dollars (\$1,128,000) as the value of the new IT equipment to be installed is reasonable for projects of that nature.
- (2) The estimate of One-Hundred and Eighty (180) individuals whose employment will be retained can be reasonably expected to result from the proposed Project.
- (3) The estimate of Eleven Million Two-Hundred and Thirty-Two Thousand Dollars (\$11,232,000) for the aggregate annual salaries of those individuals whose employment will be retained can be reasonably expected to result from the proposed Project.
- (4) The estimate of hiring Three-Hundred and Sixty (360) new individuals who will be employed through 2019 can be reasonably expected to result from the proposed Project.
- (5) The estimate of Nineteen Million Four-Hundred and Sixty-Eight Thousand and Eight Hundred Dollars (\$19,468,800). for the aggregate annual salaries without benefits of those individuals who will be employed can be reasonably expected to result from the proposed Project.
- (6) The other benefits about which information has been presented to this Council are benefits that can be reasonably expected to result from the proposed Project.
- (7) The totality of benefits is sufficient to justify the granting of a five (5) year, One Hundred percent (100%) personal property tax abatement to the Applicant.

SECTION III.

The Form SB-1 submitted by the Applicant is approved.

SECTION IV.

Personal property tax deductions for the Project are hereby approved. The period for personal property tax deductions under the Act for the Project shall be five (5) years, and for each of the

five (5) years, one hundred percent (100%) of the personal property taxes assessed on the Property shall be abated.

SECTION V.

Pursuant to the Act, the Council shall cause to be filed a certified copy of this Resolution with the Hamilton County Auditor.

SECTION VI.

This Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption.

* If the designating body limits the time period during which an area is an economic revitalization area, that limitation does not limit the length of time a taxpayer is entitled to receive a deduction to a number of years that is less than the number of years designated under IC 6-1.1-12.1-17.

IC 6-1.1-12.1-17

Abatement schedules

Sec. 17. (a) A designating body may provide to a business that is established in or relocated to a revitalization area and that receives a deduction under section 4 or 4.5 of this chapter an abatement schedule based on the following factors:

- (1) The total amount of the taxpayer's investment in real and personal property.
- (2) The number of new full-time equivalent jobs created.
- (3) The average wage of the new employees compared to the state minimum wage.
- (4) The infrastructure requirements for the taxpayer's investment.

(b) This subsection applies to a statement of benefits approved after June 30, 2013. A designating body shall establish an abatement schedule for each deduction allowed under this chapter. An abatement schedule must specify the percentage amount of the deduction for each year of the deduction. An abatement schedule may not exceed ten (10) years.

(c) An abatement schedule approved for a particular taxpayer before July 1, 2013, remains in effect until the abatement schedule expires under the terms of the resolution approving the taxpayer's statement of benefits.
