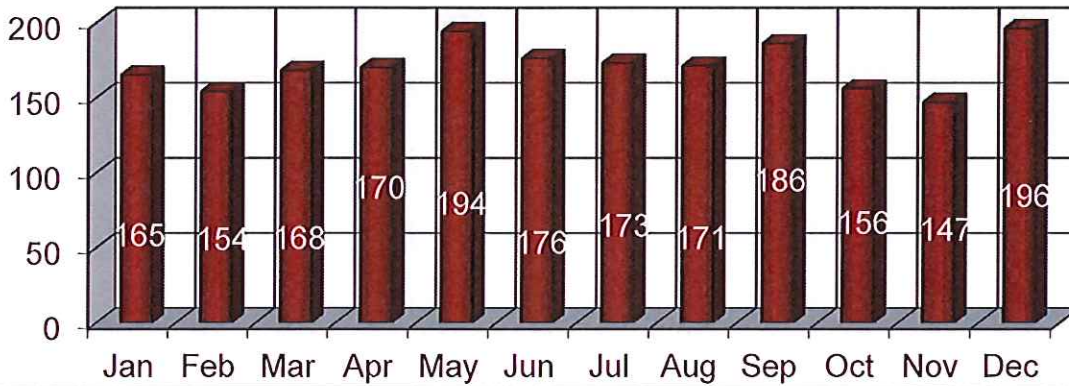


Westfield Fire Department 2014 Incident Statistics By Fire / Medical Groups

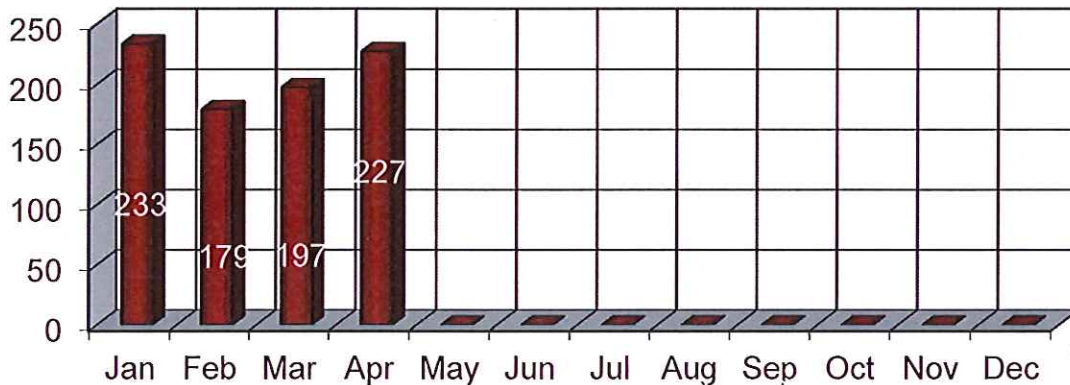

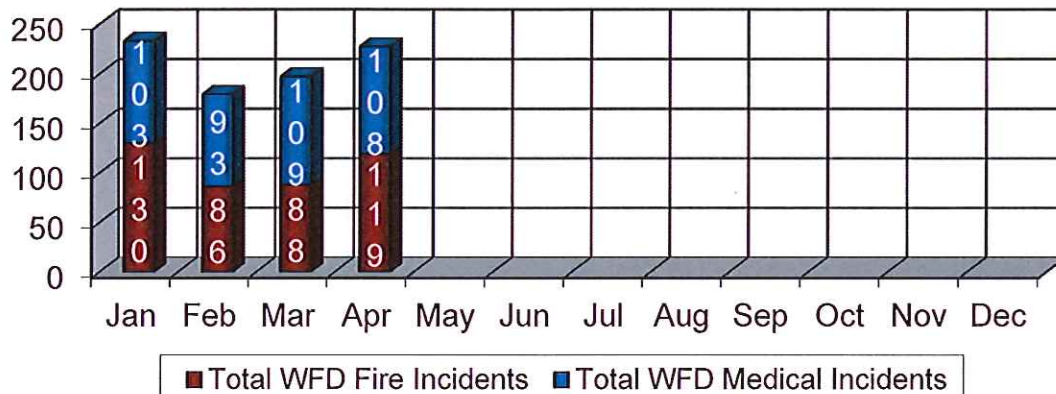

2014 Incidents by Fire/Medical



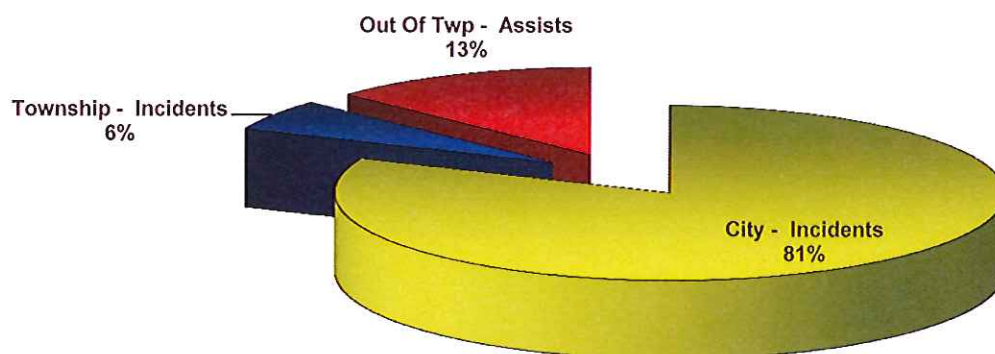

■ City - Incidents ■ Township - Incidents ■ Out Of Twp - Assists



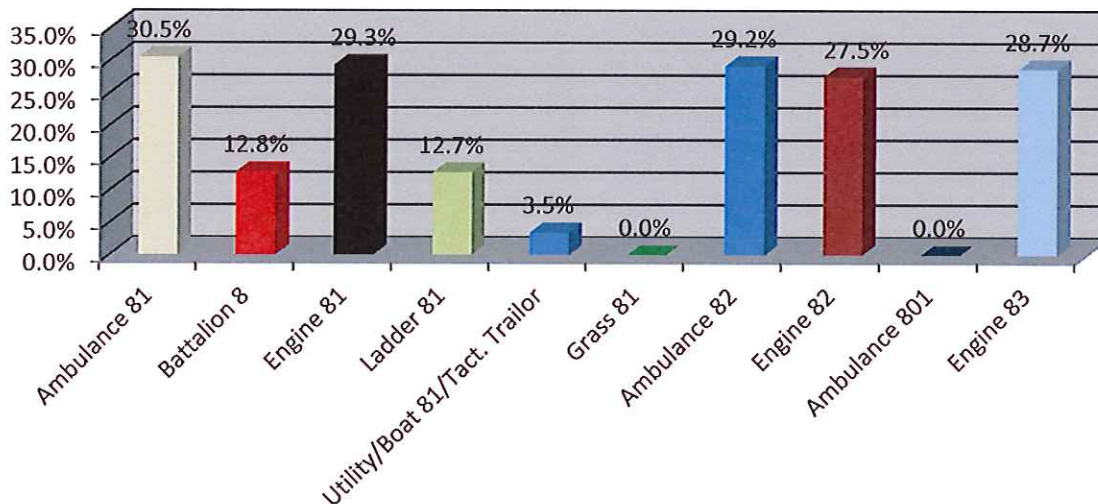

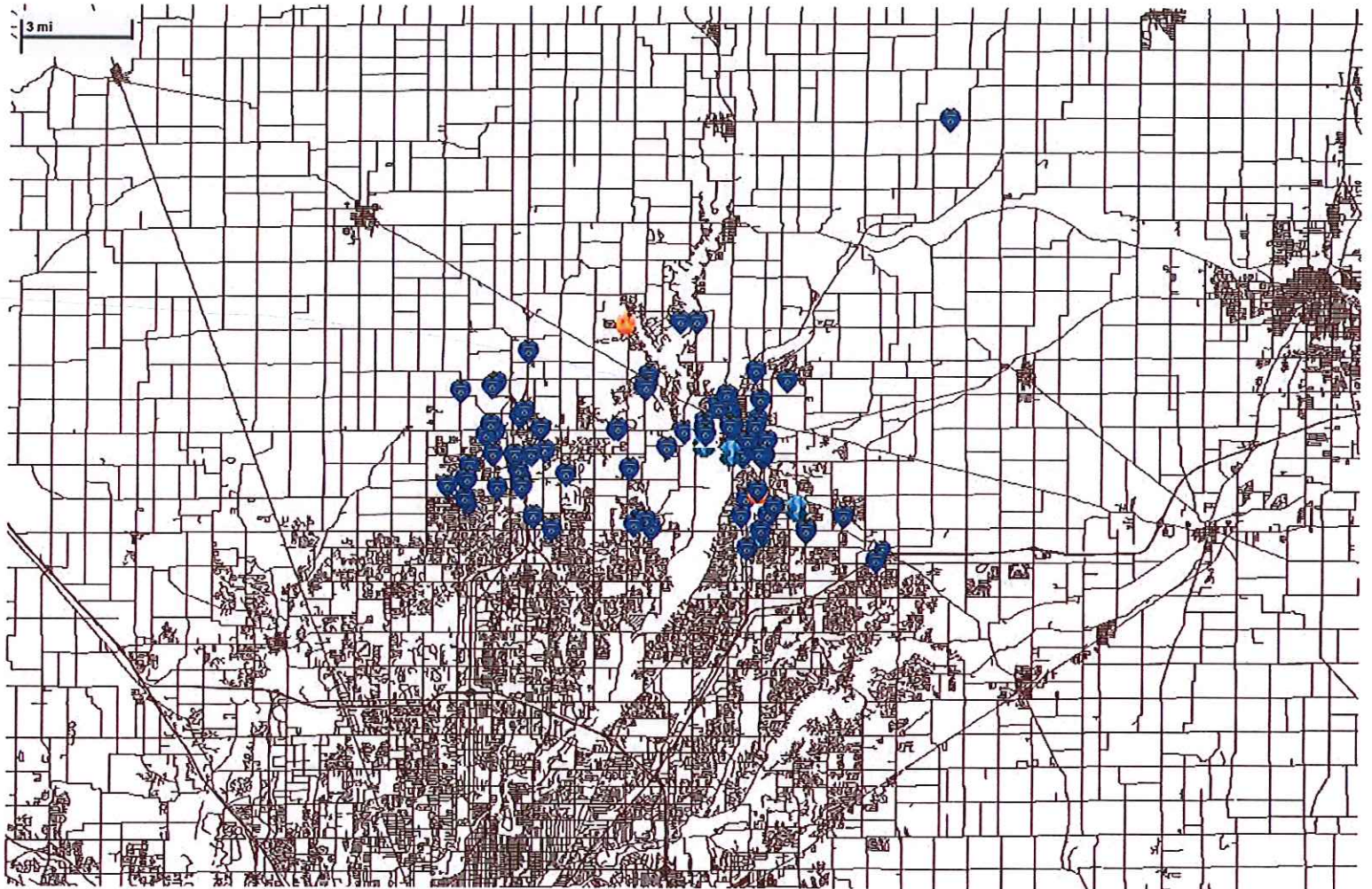

Everything is growing and everyone is playing, which means Parks and Recreation is in full swing. We are planting, planning and encouraging everyone to get outside to enjoy our wonderful city!

Internships: We have two interns that started on May 19th that will be with us through the summer. Colin Shumake is our Urban Forestry Intern and Melody Van Dusen is our Programming and Special Events Intern. Both have shown they are quick studies and jumped in with both feet. Together, they are sure to help make this season the best ever for Westfield Parks and Recreation.

Maintenance Division: The parks are open and use has gone through the roof. Maintenance Division has contracted Brickman Group to aid with general landscaping and cleaning so the three man division can have greater focus on essential projects along the parks and trails. Dear Board Members, I would like to take this opportunity to update you regarding the current status of our City projects.

Westfield Public Works Executive Summary Progress Report

1. Potholes

The Department of Public Works continues to utilize the potholes@westfield.in.gov email as a central, organized database of citizen requests and necessary repairs. The majority of issues have been resolved but we are prepared to take care of any surface issue immediately upon it becoming known.

2. Emergency Repairs

We have done emergency repairs to Carey Road, 171st, Casey Road, and Southpark Drive. so far this year. It appears that a few other spots have presented themselves requiring some deeper repair than just a surface fix. We are currently reviewing needs on east 186th Street and Westfield Park Blvd. We hope that additional emergencies can be repaired as part of our maintenance and resurfacing program but we will continue to monitor.

3. 186th Street & Grand Park Blvd. Roundabout Extension
